AUTHOR TALK | Howard Zehr | Wednesday, June 14, 7-8:30 p.m. Author of "What Will Happen to Me?", Zehr will discuss families, incarceration and restorative justice.

AUTHOR TALK | Maya Schenwar | Wednesday, June 28, 7-8:30 p.m. Author of "Locked Down, Locked Out: Why Prison Doesn't Work and How We Can Do Better", Schenwar will discuss the impact of mass incarceration on families, including her own.

AUTHOR TALK | Shaka Senghor | Thursday, July 13, 7-8:30 p.m. Discussing his bestselling memoir "Writing My Wrongs", Senghor will share stories of his incarceration that included seven years of solitary confinement and how he found redemption.
